So what is Consent?

A person consents if he or she agrees by choice, and has the freedom and capacity to make that choice. The essence of this definition is the agreement by choice. The law does not require the victim to have resisted physically in order to prove a lack of consent." (The sexual offences act, 2003)



What is Rape?

A defendant is guilty of rape if:

- A intentionally penetrates the vagina, anus or mouth of B with his penis
- B does not consent to the penetration
- A does not reasonably believe that B consents

There is an additional offence of 'assault by penetration' which covers nonconsensual penetration by other body parts or objects. Rape and assault by penetration have the same sentencing guidelines with a maximum term of life imprisonment.



What is Sexual assault?

Under the Sexual Offences Act 2003, a defendant is guilty of sexual assault if:

- The offender intentionally touches the victim
- The touching is sexual
- The victim does not consent to the touching
- The offender does not reasonably believe that the victim is consenting The maximum sentence for sexual assault is 10 years imprisonment. For rape, sexual assault and assault by penetration, there is no distinction between offences that occur in or outside of relationships. In 2013-14, 47% of serious sexual assaults were committed by a partner or ex-partner. (Office for National Statistics, 2013)



What is Sexual Harassment?

Sexual harassment is unwanted behaviour of a sexual nature which;

- A, violates your dignity;
- B, makes you feel intimated; or
- C, creates a hostile or offensive environment
